The Early Childhood Action Network (ECAN) is an open network for all those interested in making a measurable difference in the well being of young New Mexico children. From the early days of ECAN (2004), the group has utilized the Results Based Accountability (RBA) framework, developed by the Fiscal Policy Institute of Santa Fe. From RBA comes the term "Turn the Curve" which has been the name of the large ECAN meetings. Traditionally, the large Network met twice a year.
