Autism Case Training (ACT) Webinar Series

The ACT curriculum is designed to educate future healthcare providers on fundamental components of identifying, diagnosing, and managing autism spectrum disorders through real life scenarios. The curriculum was developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in collaboration with the Maternal and Child Health Bureau Developmental-Behavioral Pediatrics Fellowship Training Programs and has been endorsed by the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Society for Developmental and Behavioral Pediatrics.

The curriculum consists of the following modules:

- ◆ Module 2: Screening for Autism
- ◆ Module 3: Communicating Concerns: Screening and Diagnosis Results
- ◆ Module 4: Making an Autism Diagnosis

- ◆ Module 6: Treatments for Autism
- ◆ Module 7: Autism-Specific Anticipatory Guidance
